KRAMP REINTRODUCES PRIVATE MEMBER'S BILL TO AMEND CRIMINAL CODE

Ottawa – Yesterday, in the House of Commons, Daryl Kramp, Member of Parliament for Prince Edward-Hastings, introduced Bill C-230 which will amend the Canada Criminal Code (arrest without a warrant).

Bill C-230 proposes an amendment to the Criminal Code to give a peace officer the power to arrest, without a warrant, a person who is in breach of a probation order binding the person over the condition of the person's parole.

"In cases where a person has breached their probation", said Mr. Kramp, "there shouldn't be a big delay while warrants for arrest are prepared. A person on parole is well aware of the conditions of the parole and one condition is that they will be arrested if they break them. In the time that it takes to get a warrant, another crime could be committed, another person hurt."
